The Government of the Russian Federation has received financing in the amount of US\$ 320 million equivalent from the New Development Bank (NDB) toward the cost of the Development of Water Supply and Sanitation Systems Project, and it intends to apply part of the proceeds to payments for goods, works, non-consulting services and consulting services to be procured under this Project. This project will be jointly financed by loan funds, federal budget, regional and local budget as well as external investments.

The aim of the Project is to boost the quality and reliability of water supply and sanitation services to the population, to improve the environmental situation and to minimize the damage to the environment. Participating cities of the Project: Ivanovo, Dzerzhinsk, Cheboksary, Rybinsk and Volzhsky.

To achieve this goal, it is intended to solve the following main tasks within the framework of the Project:

- 1. Prevention of environmental pollution due to the discharge of untreated sewage, burial of sewage sludge;
- 2. Complex solution to the problems of modernization and development of municipal water supply and water disposal systems, including water treatment, waste water removal and treatment;
- 3. construction or development of storm water collection and treatment system;
- 4. Increasing the stability and resource efficiency of the water supply and water disposal enterprises;
- 5. Generalization of experience in the Project participating cities and elaboration of recommendations on the application of the accumulated experience in other cities of Russia.

The Project consists of two components:

Component 1 - "Implementation of investment plans for the integrated projects of development of the water supply and water disposal systems in the cities participating in the Project";

Purpose of component 1 - modernization and development of the water supply and sanitation systems in the Participating Cities, improving the quality and reliability of provision of water supply and sanitation services to the population, improving the environmental situation and reducing the environmental damage, including the Volga river basin, through the implementation of the integrated projects for the development of water supply and sanitation systems.

Component 2 - "Project Management and Monitoring"

Purpose of component 2 - to ensure the implementation of the Project, also monitoring, control and evaluation of the Project results.

The project is of integrated character with a complicated structure of complex projects of water supply and sanitation systems development in the Participating Cities, including a rather wide range of investment Subprojects; it is implemented with the use of Loan Funds and budget assets of various levels. In this regard, the efficient management of the Project and monitoring of the progress of the Project implementation become of particular importance for the achievement of the Project's goals.

Procurement of contracts financed by the NDB will be conducted in line with the procedures specified in NDB Procurement Policy (2016, as amended from time to time) and open to eligible bidders from NDB member countries.
