UNIQUENESS OF THE MANUAL



Recipient-centric

Puts the needs and priorities of recipient countries at the center, moving away from donor-driven approaches



Customised approach

Focuses on customising evaluation methodologies based on NDB context & recipient country priorities



Capacity development

Serves as a resource for building evaluation capacity in NDB, its members and beyond



Non-prescriptive

Offers general guidance, not strict instructions, for conducting evaluations

EVALUATION METHODS



OUANTITATIVE ANALYSIS

E.g. Primary data collection through surveys & questionnaires, statistical analysis of economic benefits.

HOW THEY INTERACT



understanding of outcomes and impact



OUALITATIVE ANALYSIS

E.g. Systematic review of multiple reports, stakeholder interviews, and community feedback.

Using a six-point rating system

Highly Successful
Achieved or surpassed
all targets
Over 95%

Successful

Achieved almost all targets

Between 80-95%

Achieved majority of the main targets

Between 60-80%

Highly Unsuccessful
Achieved almost none of the main targets

Less than 20%

Unsuccessful

Achieved only a **minority** of the main targets

Less than 50%

Moderately Unsuccessful

Did not achieve most of the main targets

Less than 60%

EVALUATION APPROACH



Theory of change (ToC)

Assess the underlying ToC to ensure it aligns with project logic



Analysis

Of cost-benefits, cost-effectiveness, social cost-benefit & environmental impact



Evaluation framework

Develop an evaluation matrix linking criteria to questions/indicators, etc.



Comprehensive review

Evaluate and link findings to ToC for insights and future recommendations
